Troy coach Ty Welker knows exactly what the Trojans will be counting on this season. "We're only going to be as good as our pitching," he said. But the Trojans have an experienced staff full of leaders returning this season as the team will look to fill a number of key roles vacated by graduation and improve on its 10-17 overall record from a year ago.

Seniors Trey Barkett, Doug Burchfield and Dhaval Shah will make up the starting rotation to begin the year. Barkett was a solid starter for the Trojans last season, with Burchfield making the transition from closer to starter. And Shah, who lettered as a sophomore, returns to the team to lend even more experience on the hill.
